

CHRIST, GOD'S MYSTERY

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The apostle Paul described Christ as "God's mystery" (Col. 2:2). The good news we share is about "the mystery of Christ" (Col. 4:3), which was hidden for many generations but has now been revealed (Colossians 1:26).

When Paul talks about "mystery," he's using a different meaning than we might think today. Back then, a mystery in biblical terms was a truth that couldn't be grasped just by human understanding. It was a deeper reality that God chose to show us, something kept secret until He decided to share it. And the mystery wasn't just for a select few—it was kept from both angels and humans until God revealed it at the right time. God's Divine Time.

The only way to truly know this "mystery" is through God sharing Himself with us, through us, as us...

Paul was given a significant insight into this mystery, making it known to everyone. Unlike the secretive mysteries of other traditions that require initiation, True Christianity openly shares its truth with the whole world as God's revelation is free and available to everyone, regardless of background. His blessings are no longer just for a specific group; instead, God offers them to all people through His grace.

There are no hidden agendas or selective secrets; the richest blessings of life—such as love, opportunity, personal growth, and salvation—are available to all individuals, regardless of their diverse backgrounds, cultural histories, or past experiences.

The foundation of this mystery is the church, which Paul describes as the body of Christ (Colossians 1:24). It might seem surprising when Paul says he can *"rejoice in my sufferings for your sake."* In other words, He found joy in Christ even in tough times (Philippians 4:4). In fact, he expresses gratitude for the chance to suffer *"on behalf of His body,"* showing a sense of purpose in his hardships. He felt that he was sharing in Christ's suffering, which might seem odd to many. Who wants to suffer, right?

In many ways, throughout our journey, we, too, share in this experience.

Are you not filled with joy when you are aware of Christ – living it, being it, demonstrating it?

Are you filled with gratitude to have the awareness of all things working together for the good, for healing, for help during your difficulties, hardships, or challenges?

When we identify with the Christ Spirit that is always within us, we know the Truth, and that Truth sets us free from the burdens we are experience in life.

I find that real-life mysteries are captivating, especially when they're well-crafted. In a way, authentic Christianity itself can feel like a mystery to people. That's largely because Christ is a mystery and having a close, personal relationship with "the Christ" can make us seem a bit mysterious too others who do not understand. Those who haven't yet encountered a personal experience of the "Christ nature within" often struggle to understand what being a true Christian and practicing Truth really means—it's something that becomes clearer through a personal experience that is developed, the raising up of the Christ Consciousness within oneself.

A.W. Tozer eloquently captured this concept in his book "Roots of Righteousness," stating that true Christians often appear unusual in many ways: "A true Christian is an oddity in many ways. They feel a tremendous love for someone they have never seen, engage in daily conversations with this unseen presence, and expect to reach heaven through the virtue of another. They willingly empty themselves to become full, acknowledge their wrongs to be declared right, descend in order to rise, find strength in their weakness, appear richest when they are poorest, and feel happiest even in their lowest moments. They embrace death to attain true life, relinquish worldly possessions to gain true wealth, and give generously so they can genuinely keep. They see the invisible, hear the inaudible, and understand what transcends human knowledge."

As followers of Christ, we are called to be different and live the great mystery of the power of God, but we are not on this path alone. We are called to demonstrate the Christ —together with all His amazing gifts—living within us through His Spirit. God's desire is to transform us to be more like Christ in every way.

The Holy Spirit is at work in our lives, and while God's methods can often seem mysterious, we can trust that the Spirit is actively changing us for the better when we live by Faith, placing our trust in Him.

Here is a story I would like to share with you to demonstrate the profound unfolding of the Mystery of Christ.
